## THE CHOIR OF ST. MATTHEW'S CATHEDRAL

The Choir of St. Matthew's Cathedral is one of the oldest continuous liturgical choirs in Dallas. The Cathedral Choir has a 100 year history of enriching the spiritual lives of parishioners with offerings of anthems, motets, sung services, and leading the congregational singing with the highest musical standards. Former distinguished Organist and Choirmasters have included Alec Wyton, Henry Sanderson, Robert Evans, James Higbe, James Livengood, Gerald Near, Ron Rice, Davis Wortman, John Bush, and Michie Akin. Thank you for your support for music at St. Matthew's Cathedral and for your warm presence online this afternoon.

**KEITH FRANKS**, Director

Keith Franks, Director of Music and Organist of the Cathedral Church of St. Matthew since 2015, has had a dual career as a teacher and church musician. Mr. Franks taught in the Dallas ISD 29 years, teaching classes in Piano, Choir, Advanced Placement World History and AP Macroeconomics. He was Assistant Organist at the Church of the Incarnation from 1996-2012. During these years he served as tour organist for the Incarnation Choir on six English cathedral residency tours from 1998 – 2011 at Westminster Abbey, Chichester Cathedral, Wells Cathedral, St. Mary's Episcopal Cathedral – Edinburgh, Lincoln Cathedral, Canterbury Cathedral, Lichfield Cathedral, Southwark Cathedral, and the Chapel of St. George – Windsor. He was the organist for several Incarnation Choir CDs with the American Record Guide congratulating Mr. Franks on "his registrations and insistent, anxious interjections" in the "Messe Solennelle" of Jean Langlais on the 2003 "With Angels and Archangels" CD. Mr. Franks has a history with St. Matthew's as he was a Staff Singer from 1975-1976 while an undergraduate at the University of North Texas and again in 1985. He sang alto in the Grace Cathedral Choir of Men and Boys in San Francisco from 1976 – 1984. After returning to Texas, he sang alto in the St. Mark's School of Texas Choir of Men and Boys from 1987 – 1992 and was included in two St. Mark's residency tours singing at Westminster Abbey and Magdalen College 1988 and later St. Mary's Episcopal Cathedral, Edinburgh and York Minster in 1990.

**JULIAN PETRALLIA** currently serves as the Organ Scholar at the Church of the Incarnation under the instruction of Director of Music and Precentor, Scott Dettra, and Associate Director of Music, Graham Schultz. Originally from St. Louis, MO, Julian and his family moved to Chatham, MA when he was five years old. From a young age, he showed an interest in all things related to music and at age eight, he began musical studies with the flute. During his time playing the flute, he performed with numerous ensembles including the Cape Cod Conservatory Flute Choir, Cape Cod Youth Symphony Orchestra, as well as several auditioned competition ensembles from around Massachusetts. Julian began studying the organ as a freshman in high school. After serving as the Organ Scholar at St. Christopher's Episcopal Church, he was appointed as the Associate Organist and Choirmaster at the First Congregational Church of Chatham, a position he held for seven years. In addition to his work at Church of the Incarnation, Julian is also a candidate for a Master of Music degree in organ performance from Southern Methodist University where he is a student of Scott Dettra. Prior to his studies at SMU, he earned his Bachelor of Music degree in organ performance from the Eastman School of Music where he studied organ with Nathan Laube and harpsichord with Edoardo Bellotti. During his time in Rochester, he served as Organist for the First Baptist Church of Rochester (ABCUSA). Part of his personality is his immense love of nature, which leads him to pursue outdoor activities such as biking, photography, and free diving during his free time.
