## Page 2 Vestry Meeting Minutes, February 15, 2022 Senior Warden Report Election of Clerk ••• **David Pinson** Diane Wiles made a motion to elect Erica Lasenvik as Clerk. 0 Annie Foster seconded the motion. 0 The motion carried unanimously. 0 Election of Treasurer \* David Pinson made a motion to elect Tim Mack as Treasurer. $\cap$ Bob Jones seconded the motion. 0 The motion carried unanimously. 0 Election of Junior Warden. 0 David Pinson made a motion to elect Janet Schoenecker as Junior Warden. Adele Ichilian seconded the motion. 0 The motion carried unanimously. 0 Nomination of Endowment Board Members. David Pinson made a motion to nominate Tim Mack, Randy Staff and Dick Wiles to be submitted as nominees as Endowment Board Member. Janet Schoenecker seconded the motion. 0 The motion to nominate Tim Mack, Randy Staff and Dick Wiles for the Endowment Board trustee position passed unanimously. Appointment of Senior Warden of the Vestry. Dean Price announced that he had appointed David Pinson as Senior 0 Warden. Construction Update - Garret Hall. Demolition started in full on the second floor. 0 Starting February 16, the women's restroom on the first floor will be 0 out of order as demolition begins for the new restroom. Plumbing demolition has commenced and electrical work is being 0 conducted. Mechanical work scheduled to begin in the next week. 0 AV/IT for the Diocese on the third floor is being identified per their 0 specifications for their own networks. David Pinson receives a weekly construction report from Talley Riggins 0 and will report monthly to the Vestry on progress. If you want to read more about Talley Riggins, please see the recent article published on the front page of the Dallas Business Journal. Annie Foster raised the following questions for discussion regarding the \* development: What is the scope of the Garret Hall project and use of space and will 0 pictures be made available to the parish? Has space in Garrett Hall been considered as a new gallery space for SMCA? SMCA could raise the money for this development.

- David relayed that currently, there is not a designated space in development in Garrett Hall for a new SMCA gallery space. In meetings with the SMCA directors regarding the development, there were not requests made for a designated gallery space in Garrett Hall. Suggestions are welcome for discussion.
   Floorplans of the development will be shared with the Vestry and parish as they become available.
- The goal is to have color boards available by the next Vestry meeting in March.

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Senior Warden Report Cont'd David Pinson	<ul> <li>The entrance off Ross Avenue is a critical element of the development and what plans have been made for the entrance?</li> <li>The current renderings for the Ross Avenue entrance were explained and discussed, and the current concept rendering was shared with the new vestry members.</li> <li>David Pinson met with the landscape architects the day prior to Vestry meeting and the architectural plans and costing are in development. The plans are targeted to be available after Easter.</li> <li>The new radius configuration of the porch will not start until after April.</li> <li>The Development team knows that the re-designed entrance, landscape design and branding/signage is critical to the success of the development.</li> <li>Adele Ichilian confirmed that the entrance has been a key element under consideration since the beginning of the development process and Tim Mack confirmed that TCR (Trammel Crow Residential) is equally invested in the entrance design as it is also the entrance to the apartment buildings.</li> </ul>

Development Report Tim Mack, Chair	<ul> <li>Water 15, 7pm. Vestly freeding</li> <li>The next tracker reports are out. We haven't spent much this month. We will update future spend.</li> <li>We were approached and have received a proposal for development of a retail space on the Henderson and Ross corner. We advised we are not ready to mov forward with the development of this as yet, however, have requested they submit a proposal in three scenarios for consideration: as a sale, as a ground lease and as a partnership. The developer is aware that we are taking the development process slowly, and are in no hurry to make a decision.</li> <li>We have had other interested parties in this section of our land already.</li> <li>Annie Foster inquired regarding possible obstructed site lines from Ross Avenu to the Church with development options. That is and will be considered with the development offers we may receive.</li> <li>All businesses being considered for development of the Henderson corner will be assessed for legal requirements in proximity to a Church and any school being run at the Church.</li> <li>Question was raised on the plan if we decide against having a school on property. The development would come back to vestry to explore options.</li> <li>Question was raised on if the plumbing upgrades being done now in Garrett Hall will accommodate future planned use for a possible school or other entity. David Pinson confirmed that an oversized line out to the street is being installe to create capacity for future planned use.</li> </ul>	

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Development Report Cont'd Tim Mack, Chair	<ul> <li>David Pinson relayed that needed lighting on the bell tower is being researched.</li> <li>Saving the pecan tree is still being assessed for viability. We will try to keep the tree, but it will mean that some parking will be lost.</li> <li>Decision Item: Dean Price requested \$25,000 of the \$125,000 budget currently in place for the roof/other uses be earmarked to conduct a feasibility study for a pre-school being placed in Garrett Hall and called for a motion to approve.</li> <li>Funds would be utilized to hire a consultant, assess building needs, licensing and marketability.</li> <li>Gilda Hurst, wife of the rector of St. James, would help with licensing and resources from other Episcopal schools in the diocese.</li> <li>A business plan would be developed.</li> <li>The pre-school would be an additional expense above the current renovation project in Garrett Hall.</li> <li>Annie Foster made a motion to approve the use of \$25,000 from the \$125,000 budget for roof/other for a pre-school feasibility study.</li> <li>Janet Schoenecker seconded the motion.</li> <li>The motion passed unanimously.</li> </ul>	
SMCA Update Bob Jones	<ul> <li>February is Black History month and will proceed with a piano concert featuring Donnie Ray.</li> <li>March season is proceeding with the Invitational Art Exhibit showing ten artists.</li> <li>A scaled-down Gala is planned for Friday, May 6<sup>th</sup>.</li> <li>Adele Ichilian is now co-chair to the Pillar Campaign.</li> </ul>
